

YOUNG PROFESSIONALS PROGRAMME (YPP) - 2021

UNESCO is launching a call, through the Namibia National Commission for UNESCO, for applications to the Young Professionals Programme 2021! This programme provides talented, highly qualified university graduates and young professionals the opportunity to join UNESCO at the early stage of their professional career.

The objectives: Improving the geographical representation of UNESCO; and Enriching and diversifying the UNESCO staff.

A. Eligibility Criteria for the YPP 2021: (Who are we looking for?):

Nationality and age: Namibian. Age limit is 32 years old maximum (i.e., not born before 1st January 1990).

Education: Advanced University degree (Master's or equivalent) in in the following areas: Education, Culture, Communications, Social and Human Sciences, Business Administration, Accounting/Finance, Law, International Relations.

Languages: Fluent English or French. Knowledge of both working languages would be an asset. Knowledge of Arabic, Chinese, Russian or Spanish would be an additional asset.

Experience: Initial professional experience is an asset, but not mandatory.

Values: Integrity, professionalism, respect for diversity and a strong commitment to UNESCO's mission.
